ous problems for district farmers, ranging from flooded salt drains to stranded cattle. The weekend average ranged from 75 mm to 80 mm - equivalent to 3 inches to 3.25 inches.

Murrabit and Myall were the worst hit with 105 mm of rain and farmers reported cattle standing in up to 30 cm of water.

Gonn Crossing received 93 mm and water lay over much of the ground. The height of the Murray River was the highest some had ever seen at Koondrook and Gonn Crossing.

Koondrook received 82 mm and some farms were flooded severely with up to half of some properties under water. Milk production was down and there was more water most had ever seen.

Thirty-one mm was recorded around Benjeroop with farmers using pumps to relieve drainage problems.

A quarter of the annual rainfall was recorded areas around Gunbower and paddocks were inundated after 32 mm fell.




The heavy rain fall caused most farmen various problems but all were confident that they could overcome this latest bout of flooding and resume normal farming activities without too much disruption.
