remembered and honoured military service men and women lost during wartime conflict and peacekeeping missions. 2023 commemorates 108 years since Anzac troops landed at Gallipoli in World War I and 50 years since the end of the Vietnam War.

At the Anzac Eve sunset service on Anzac Hill, Maldon, thoughts were extended to all Veterans of War. Bendigo West MP Maree Edwards made special mention of the sacrifice of the soldiers who fought in Korea as 2023 also

marks the 70th anniversary of the end of the Korean War. Often referred to as the forgotten war, more than 17,000 Australians served, and more than 330 were killed. Australians continue to serve in the demilitarised zone between North and South Korea.

The RSL Anzac March was well attended, as was the service at the Shire Gardens Cenotaph. The service included the story of Clarence Ambler Edhouse, a Maldon local who enlisted at the age of 19 and died in action in France in 1918. He will not be forgotten.

Veterans of war still face challenges today, that include

mental health struggles and homelessness, while Iran, Afghanistan and Middle East veterans are seeking out support services more than ever.

Every year, the Anzac Appeal raises much-needed funds to run programs for the support the welfare of all veterans.

As war rages in Ukraine and many other parts of the world, and our defence forces continue their services engaging in peacekeeping and security operations, honouring our service men and women of the past and the present remains a vitally important ritual.

Lest we forget.

Easter Parade Petition

A last-minute decision that saw VicRoads allow for the complete closure of High Street for the duration of the Easter Parade is threatened to be the last gesture of its kind.

The Easter Fair Committee requested permission for the street closure in December of 2022 and only procured the go-ahead at the eleventh hour under the proviso that the committee provide four variable messaging sign boards on each of the four arterial roads leading to Maldon, alerting heavy vehicle drivers of the road closure and directing them to seek an alternate route. The conditions were accepted but at a personal cost to the committee. Fortunately, financial support was received from Maree Edward MP, a long-time supporter of the beloved parade.

In future years, the Department of Transport and Planning will not accept a full or partial road closure unless suitable detours are in place. They are recommending that the parade route be relocated altogether as the best solution to the problem of managing truck traffic.

A petition has been gathering momentum that demands the Parade be permitted to continue using its current route indefinitely. It asks that the event be recognised as a long-standing tradition of great importance to the community.

A second suggested plea is to permanently request B-double truck traffic avoid High St, Maldon entirely. Arguments range from preserving the ambience of Victoria's First Notable Town to the safety of pedestrians and the damage that vibrations from heavy vehicles can cause historic structures.

Voices for the Voiceless



DESPITE strong public opposition, Victoria's native bird shooting season has commenced and will continue until 30 May.

Gunfire pierced the air from early Wednesday morning across Cairn Curran and its surrounds, sending birds into panic and residents into despair.

"It's outrageous that rate-paying residents are forced to endure this barbarism each year for the fun of a small number of blokes who like to fire shotguns at little birds," said a resident near Cairn Curran. "We can't enjoy our own homes, our kids and animals are traumatised and our friends from the city won't visit because they get too upset. At the end of it, we're left with plastic ammo cartridges and dead and dying birds around our beautiful waterway. It's not right."

A community petition in 2021 showed overwhelming local support to end bird shooting in the area. Yet despite there being countless other areas where shooters can shoot, the local waterways remain open to them. Less than half of one per cent of the population shoots birds, according to Game Management Authority data.

There is growing resentment towards Goulburn Murray Water (GMW), who could stop the shooting at their storages, according to documents obtained through Freedom of Information. "It's perplexing why GMW allow bird shooting," says Regional Victorians Opposed to Duck Shooting inc (RVOTDS). "GMW know that the shooting poses safety risks even to their own staff, according to the documents obtained via FOI".

RVOTDS is thanking the public for a terrific response to its survey. In less than a week, over 660 respondents have provided their experiences of bird shooting.

The results are damning. More than half of the respondents reported experiencing stress or anxiety due to bird shooting nearby. A huge 89.4% said they had reported illegal hunting to authorities and 89.6% said they were not satisfied with how their reports were managed. A significant 56% said safety was a concern with duck or quail shooting occurring nearby and a whopping 97.3% said they did not believe bird shooting was a benefit to their community.

These statistics will be included in the group's submission to the Victorian Parliamentary Inquiry into native bird shooting. RVOTDS is urging the public to make a submission to the inquiry if they haven't already and to complete their short survey. The public is also being urged to check for wounded birds around the waterways if safe to do so, and to report suspected illegal hunting, including bird shooting occurring before 8am or after dark. More details at https://www.regionalvictoriansotds.com/report-unlwaful-activity.

CASTLEMAINE Pride returns in 2023, and this year's festival is jam-packed with musical offerings to make your heart sing.

The event that started life in 2018 as a picnic to help heal from the impacts of the marriage equality debate has grown into a week-long celebration of the culture, history, creativity and determination of the LGBTQIA+ community in Mount Alexander Shire.

Still battling intolerance and worse, the Castlemaine Pride co-founder Sherene Clow (she/her) says, "There is a staggering amount of backlash directed towards the queer community at present, but the way we overcome that as a community is with our joy. Pride-goers can enjoy a program that includes talks, tennis, cinema, live music, drag, a scavenger hunt and a dance party. "We've welcomed so many new members, and the choir is going from strength to strength, which I think is a testament to the power of music to build community."

Special guests of the festival are the Melbourne Gay and Lesbian Chorus — the southern hemisphere's longest-running



LGBTQIA+ choir — who are bringing their smash-hit show *MGLC's Mega Mixtape!* to Castlemaine Pride audiences on Saturday 6 May at the Town Hall. Described as 'bangers galore', audiences can expect to bop along to a mix of chart-toppers from the 80s to today and featuring hits from Adele, Harry Styles, Kate Bush and Alanis Morrisette, to name a few.

If audiences feel like trying some harmonies of their own, they can head along to Shedshaker Brewery on Saturday 6 May, for a special Pride edition of PubSing Castlemaine, where they can close out the festival by learning an iconic queer anthem in three parts, then belting it out among friends and allies.

The picnic — as with most events in the festival — is free to attend. Always a family-friendly event, this year, there will be some extra special entertainment for kids courtesy of The Connected Circus.

It Takes a Village



AS the weather starts to cool, it's time to hunker down and get set for the long winter. But for many without homes, that's a comfort not afforded to them. There are currently 64 people known to be homeless on any given night in the Mount Alexander Shire, and more than 200 families are seeking assistance for the housing crisis.

While Victorians represent 27 percent of Australia's total of people experiencing homelessness, the Mount Alexander Shire figures are over 30 percent. What's understood from these figures is that the true number is likely much higher. Cost of living has skyrocketed, and access to affordable housing is almost non-existent. Numerous factors have coalesced to create a perfect storm, and it's leaving many people vulnerable in its wake.

Captain of the Maldon Fire Brigade Sean McCubbin says, "As a community, we have to look after our most vulnerable. Everyone is doing it tough - or might be one day - and we all have a responsibility to find solutions."

Many factors contribute to homelessness, including a lack of affordable housing, rising costs of living, and family and domestic violence. People on low or single incomes

are less likely to find suitable and affordable housing and more likely to experience homelessness. The problem affects people of all ages and backgrounds, with four populations - elders, people living with disability, Indigenous people and sole parents - disproportionately affected.

At a community housing forum presented by My Home Network held last Sunday at the Town Hall in Castlemaine, three tiers of government came together to discuss ways that they are committed to addressing the crisis, now and into the foreseeable future.

Mount Alexander Shire

Mayor Rosie Annear said, "This kind of allyship is rare. The council and the community are all aligned on this issue."

Other government officials in attendance were Federal Bendigo MP Lisa Chesters, Bendigo West State MP Maree Edwards, the council's Housing Officer Clare Richards and Strategic Planning Coordinator Lauren Watt. Each representative spoke passionately about the worsening crisis and the dire need to address the issue from multiple angles.

A critical factor in confronting the issue is tackling stigma.

"Everyone has a role to play in that," says MP Chesters. "Homelessness can and does happen to anyone, whether previously middle-class or not. Life circumstances can change in unforeseeable ways."

Homelessness and the risk of homelessness can profoundly affect a person's mental and physical health, with cascading consequences impacting their ability to participate fully in society. Compassion is needed to understand that while meeting a need, building social housing in our region will bring untold benefits to our diverse community.

From the perspective of a first responder, Sean McCubbin is keen to see change that helps mitigate the potential risks taken as a result of not having access to basic services. Cooking over gas inside a caravan with no fire alarm of flue is one such example. Sean says that the mental health toll on emergency workers faced with avoidable disaster scenarios is significant.

"I just hope it doesn't take a tragedy for us to realise that we need to get involved," Sean said.

"It's in all of our best interests to brainstorm solutions, especially in the immediate short term, while people are really doing it rough."

My Home Network is one such enterprise facing the challenge. Coordinated by Dhelkaya Health, it has a database of over 115 people which includes lived experience of homelessness and the housing crisis, community members with many years of expertise in the delivery of social and innovative housing programs and a diverse range of relevant networks and community and government organisations.

MHN advocates for greater housing support to vulnerable people in the community and increased and improved crisis, transition, social and affordable housing provisions. The network also explores innovative solutions with local community members to meet long-term housing needs and reduce housing stress.

One idea being explored is called a Home Share Model, which brings together older householders who could benefit from companionship and some help to stay independent, with a home sharer who can assist in that care arrangement in return for affordable accommodation.

The council recently called for residents of Maldon and Newstead with an interest in housing to join a Community Reference Group. The group will work with the council and play an essential role in two new long-term planning projects while helping to foster a constructive collaboration between the Council and the community.

Other ideas for community contributions include volunteering your skills, time and knowledge, whether as a cook, tradesperson, architect or by helping people complete housing register applications. If you own or have access to spare rooms, empty homes, or above shop dwellings and can make them available for crisis, medium or long term rent, please reach out to the council. Consider listing your rental with a not-for-profit real estate agent who donate profits to the cause. If you are in a position to, consider donating land, property or cash for use towards appropriate and affordable housing developments.

We all have a role to play in looking after our most vulnerable community members, and finding solutions to address homelessness. Everyone has a right to safe, affordable and secure housing, so it's crucial we take action now to create a better future for us all.

Maldon Cemetery


Yes! Yet another letter to the editor in response to the obvious unresolved verbal conflict between disappointed community members and a frustrated Cemetery Trust and volunteers.


So may I suggest that all sides stop barking at each other and work together by offering some practical solutions to this presentation and appearance problem.

An open letter to Treasurer Jim Chalmers regarding the Budget

Dear Dr Chalmers,

There's a crisis in our country you can fix in your first budget, at no extra cost.

With the stroke of a pen you could help secure the future of critical regional news services, using money already allocated in the budget.

All you need to do is allocate a fairer percentage of the federal government's advertising budget to local and regional news services, rather than spending almost all of it with corporate capital city media and foreign-owned digital platforms (which don't produce any content or employ any journalists).

This can be achieved by simply adopting the Victorian Govt policy that mandates a weekly full page government advertisement in every regional and community paper.

Local and regional newspapers connect more than 80% of the country, but they get almost 0% of the government advertising spend.

In an era where false news spreads faster on social media than the truth does, trusted local news services reach more regional Australians than any other medium.

And unlike other media, every government dollar spent with a local newspaper is also an investment in regional journalism jobs.

This shouldn't be controversial.

A recent parliamentary inquiry recommended that a minimum of 20% of government print advertising should be placed with regional news services. A recent study conducted by Deakin University recommended the same thing. In fact, the Minister for Communications, Michelle Rowland, has been advocating for more regional newspaper advertising for many years.

We know there may be bigger budget issues, but this small policy change would be a simple and fair solution to a growing problem for regional Australia.

A policy that ensures weekly federal government advertising is placed in regional newspapers would be great news for the country.

And it won't cost you a cent.

VGR Update

THE Victorian Goldfields Railway's heritage steam train linking the historic towns of Castlemaine and Maldon, is yet another one of the magnificent features of our region. The VGR run everything from locally brewed beer-tasting train rides to a dress-up, champagne-in-hand viewing of Murder on the Orient Express as the train winds its way through the night.

Recently, the steam locomotive, known as J549, was withdrawn from service to allow the mechanical department to undertake a full boiler inspection and Re-Tube. Works commenced in January 2023 with expectations that it will return to service at the end of July 2023.

The boiler inspector has completed the disassembly tasks and undertaken some work inside the boiler to ensure it continues to steam well into the future. The team are now commencing the installation of the new tubes and starting to put it back together. These works will ensure that with regular maintenance, this beauty should provide much more reliable service for at least the next 10 years before a full inspection will need to be undertaken again.

The cost of undertaking this work has been budgeted at \$70,000, and VGR is seeking interest from members and friends of the railway to assist in funding these works. They also have a blog that provides regular updates as they progress towards reintroducing the loco back into service.

The committee has raised two-thirds of the funds needed to complete the overhaul. All donations are much appreciated, with all donations over \$2 tax-deductible. If you can help out, please visit www.vgr.com.au/donate.

Ask Your Vet

Q. Just how good is a dog's sense of smell?

We all know that dogs have an amazing sense of smell – they can use it almost like a superpower to locate lost people, detect drugs and explosives, and even sniff out certain cancers. But what exactly is it that makes their sense of smell so powerful?

It is hard for us humans to comprehend because we rely mostly on our sense of sight to navigate the world around us, whereas dogs rely predominantly on their sense of smell. Smells are chemical compounds detected by sensory receptors in the nose. While humans have approximately 5-6 million of these receptors, dogs can have more than 100 million! In fact, dog breeds that are known to have exceptional skills in using their nose, such as bloodhounds, can have up to 300 million receptors. If you've ever wondered why your dog's nose is wet or why they sometimes lick their nose, it's because their nose works better when it's damp. By wetting the outside of their nose, combined with mucous in their nasal passages, they can more effectively trap scent particles for processing.

If that wasn't enough, dogs also have a second organ devoted to picking up particular chemical scents called pheromones. This organ is called Jacobsen's organ, or the vomeronasal organ, and is located within the nasal cavity and opens into the roof of the mouth. If you ever see your dog extend their neck and lift their upper lip while inhaling through their nose, this action is called the 'Flehmen response' and it means they are gathering scents into their vomeronasal organ for processing. Finally, canines devote a much larger portion of their brain (up to 40 times) to deciphering scents than humans.

In addition to being able to detect and process smells to such a great degree, dogs are able to use this information in a variety of ways. They have a good scent memory and use this in association with sight, sound and other senses to form memories of their owners and be able to differentiate between different family members. This association memory can last for several days to weeks and the more often it is reinforced the longer it will last, which is how a dog can recognise its owner even after years of being apart. Dogs use scents to bond with their owners by associating them with good memories, and studies have even shown that when dogs are exposed to scents that are familiar to them, it activates the part of their brain associated with positive feelings. If your dog ever needs to spend time away from home, in a vet clinic or in a kennel or with a friend, it can help to leave them with a blanket or toy that has their scent on it to make them feel safe and secure. And if they ever get lost or run away, a dogs' sense of smell can act as a powerful homing device to help them navigate their way home.

ANZAC DAY 1917

ON Wednesday 25 April 1917, the second anniversary of the Gallipoli landing was commemorated in Maldon. The Tarrangower Times said the landing had marked 'the birth of a nation, a birth that took place in a bitter travail, by which Australia was enabled to take her place among the nations of the world'. Apart from the hoisting of Union Jacks on Anzac Hill and elsewhere in town, the main observance was held at the Maldon State School.

For the ceremony, the school grounds were decorated with bunting and the flags of the Allied nations. Over 100 parents and friends watched as the students assembled around the flagpole in front of the school. The proceeding opened with the children saluting the flag, reciting the Oath of Allegiance and singing the National Anthem.

Local GP, Dr Colin Gray, then addressed the assembly. Anzac Day, he said, would forever be one of the great days in Australian history. Every nation had a history made up of the major events that formed it and prominent amongst these events were the wars they had fought. Until this Great War, Dr Gray believed that Australia's history had only consisted of the exploration of the continent and matters of Government. Now, however, that Australians, including many from Maldon, were fighting for freedom and rights, commemorating the first Anzac Day was a great milestone in Australia's history. Dr Gray then gave a thrilling account of the landing at Anzac Cove and urged the children to learn from the Anzac the virtues of obedience and loyalty.

Following the singing of Rule Britannia and Kipling's Recessional hymn, the Rev William Rule Jones spoke. He said that he was privileged to have been asked to unveil a photograph of Private Harry Johnson, the first Maldon soldier to die at Gallipoli in defence of liberty. Harry had been a pupil at the school and his photo would now adorn its walls to remind students of one who had done his duty with honour and had laid down his life for his country. The Rev Rule Jones concluded his speech by reading a recently published poem by Maldon writer Grace Ethel Martyr. The poem was entitled *In Memory of April 25, 1915*.

Headteacher Robert Smith gave the final address. He told the children that when they grew up, they would realise how much they owed the Anzacs. They would learn that these men had gone to war because they loved their country. Smith also said that after the war, the country would have heavy burdens to bear and the children of today must prepare to bear these burdens. They could, therefore, best honour the Anzacs by growing up as good citizens. The commemoration concluded with the singing of more patriotic songs and three cheers for the Anzacs.







A Spiritual Response to the Voice to Parliament

Too often, our spiritual beliefs become focused on ourselves as individuals. But Christianity has always been profoundly political because of its concern for justice for the poor and oppressed. For those of us who live with faith, it is of utmost importance that we ask ourselves what our faith in God teaches us about how to relate to others. And in terms of the proposed Voice, what a path towards justice and healing might look like. It is only through a process of listening and prayerful discernment that we can begin to see the right way forward.

For these reasons, Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Maldon, will be hosting an evening considering 'A Spiritual Response to the Voice to Parliament' on Sunday 4 June. Among the panel will be Reverend Neville Naden from the Aboriginal Evangelical Fellowship, artist and Wiradjuri man Reverend Canon Glenn Loughrey, Gurindji man Australian National Aboriginal Bishop Chris McLeod and Wiradjuri woman Aboriginal Communities Officer Revd Shannon Smith, pictured. I hope you can join us for this very special opportunity to hear from such an outstanding panel. More details about the event will be published closer to the date.




