Alpaca fun for all


SURI alpacas are known for their long necks, cute faces and soft wool - and now a small herd of them are entertaining and educating visitors in central Victoria.

Redbank Alpacas at Blue Gum Rise provides visitors with the unique opportunity to interact with alpacas up close while learning about their history, purpose, and habits.

Hosts Andrew and Debra Borg have been operating Redbank Alpacas since 2015. They have evolved their alpaca farm into a successful eco-tourism enterprise encompassing land rehabilitation through tree planting and participation in captive breeding programs for endangered species.

Their 40-hectare property, located alongside Kara Kara National Park in Redbank, offers two exciting activities for visitors.

The first is the Alpaca Experience. Small groups can pat and feed an alpaca while learning about their history in Australia as stock guards and the different uses of their fleece.



The second is Alpaca Treks, which begin with an Alpaca Experience followed by a guided walk around the property with alpacas on harnesses – made extra entertaining by what happens when the alpacas spot the eucalyptus saplings on the hillside!


Fun and friendship at the Maldon Folk Festival





Bendigo is just a 90-minute drive from




Melbourne via the Calder Freeway, or travel in comfort on a V-Line train from Southern Cross Station.

The National Trust-listed building has been carefully renovated to include all modern-day comforts while retaining the ornately decorated interiors reflecting the gold rush wealth of the mid-1800s.

The Laanecoorie Gold Bash is back this year after a two-year hiatus, and organisers expect an enthusiastic turnout as visitors gather together to celebrate their passion for prospecting. From October 7 to 9, the Laanecoorie Lakeside Park will play host to the Bash, which will feature stalls and displays, workshops, lectures and a lot of fun.

Organiser Di Hodgson said the committee is excited to welcome people back to the event and raise some much-needed funds for the Peter McCallum Cancer Foundation.

"It's a very welcoming environment, prospectors are really supportive of people new to the hobby," she said.

Di suggests people coming for the weekend book a spot at the caravan park as soon as possible. As well as local B&Bs and motels, the



area also offers free camping not far from the event. Entry is free, so visitors can pop in for the day or make the most of the three days. Catering is available, or people can bring their own food, with onsite barbecues and toilet facilities available.

As a relative new comer to the prospecting world, Di encourages anyone to come along no matter their experience.

"For people new to the Bash, bring your sense of humour, be open minded," she said.

"Detectorists are a breed of their own. They are special."

Full steam ahead

THE Lake Goldsmith Steam Preservation Association will invite the public to experience living history on the weekend of October 28 to 30 when it holds the 120th Steam and Vintage Rally.

Set on 38 acres in picturesque Lake Goldsmith, approximately 15 kilometres from Beaufort, the association started in 1942 when a group of local farmers held steam traction engine shows for American servicemen stationed in the area.

After the war, the farmers continued to meet and in the early '60s established a permanent presence on the current site.

Association secretary Graeme Milton has been going to the club since those early days, and his passion for the power of steam has grown throughout the years.

"I love steam and used to read everything I could." Graeme said.

"I belonged to a club in Melbourne, then heard there was a steam thresher up at Lake Goldsmith. I didn't even have my driver's license, but went there with my cousin and never looked back."

Lake Goldsmith is unique on the Australian

Rally scene as it has more than 60 permanent sheds owned by club members which house their collections.

As well as on-site displays, the rally will showcase machines owned by avid collectors from throughout the country.

"We have both agricultural and industrial machines, and we encourage collectors to contact us if they are interested in displaying their machines over the weekend," Graeme said.

With some machines dating back to the 1800s, visitors can learn about the history of steam as it correlates to the history of technical progress throughout the past two centuries. As tractors and trains replaced horses, vast tracts of land were opened for farming, mining and settlement.

While many of the items on display have long-ago been replaced, they have been given a new lease of life at the Lake Goldsmith site.

Graeme said there will be catering throughout the day, or visitors are welcome to bring their own food. Gates open at 8am. For more information go to:

"As kids we were off to car shows on the weekends," Kyle said.


"We started

Cast iron campfire oven (pot) Steel campfire tripod (optional) Campfire grill (optional)



Method

Make sure logs are glowing and you have plenty of firewood on hand. Place oven directly on logs, on a grill plate or hang from tripod.

Heat the oil in the oven. Add the beef and cook until brown on all sides, 10 to 15 minutes.

Add the onions and garlic and cook until the onions begin to soften, about 5 minutes. Season well with salt and pepper and stir in the tomato paste, to coat.

Sprinkle the flour over the beef mixture and toss to coat, making sure the flour is well absorbed. Slowly stir in the beef stock. Add enough water so the liquid level comes about 2 centimetres above the meat.

Add all other ingredients

Cover and cook for at least an hour and a half, ensuring the beef is tender and the veggies cooked through. Lift the lid and stir occasionally, adding more liquid if needed.

Perfect served with warm damper.
