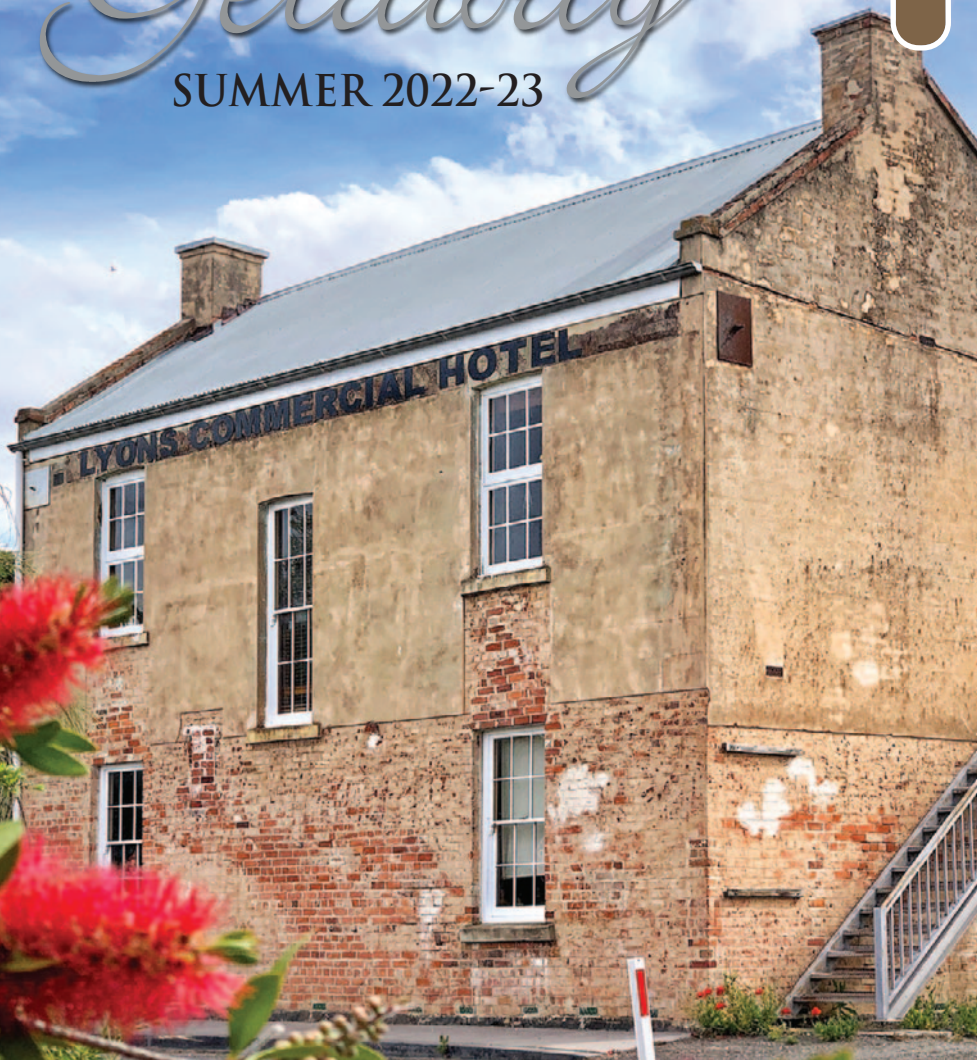

Lyons Commercial Hotel Building, Talbot by Jayne Newgreen

The back section of the Lyons Commercial Hotel building form part of the Talbot Market Square. Opened in 1859, the hotel had 26 rooms and was the stopping place of Cobb & Co coaches. The hotel closed in 1962 and the front two storey section of the building was demolished in 1991.

The Talbot Square Market redevelopment includes the remaining hotel rooms (now galleries and speciality shops), a GP clinic, a café and a community garden.

Explore a local treasure

NEED somewhere to make a discovery? Then Buda Historic Home and Garden is the place to go in Castlemaine.

You will find delights for young and old alike. History buffs, gardeners, those interested in the Arts and Crafts Movement, decorative metalwork, enamelling, art, gold and silver, furniture, clocks and embroidery; imaginative explorers of any age can experience time travel to a family living in Castlemaine over 100 years ago. Outdoors and indoors, there is so much on offer.

For younger visitors there is a nice balance of outdoor activities with magic secret-garden games inspired by all the paths and hiding places. Explore the kitchen garden, the remains of the palatial chook pens and the Victorian style bird aviary with the canaries singing madly and the cutest zebra finches flitting about in the beautiful metalwork fountain made by Dorothy Leviny.

Inside tells the story of a family from long



ago and how they lived, worked and created artworks which we still appreciate today. Download the Treasure Hunt App (or pick up a paper version) and search for treasure.

Visitors are welcome at Buda seven days a week from 12 pm to 4 pm without booking. Come and explore this unique gem of the Goldfields in beautiful Castlemaine.

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A new year celebration like no other

THERE aren't too many events in Australia that can claim to have thrived and survived for over 150 years and, after a two-year hiatus, the Maryborough Highland Gathering is back for its 160th instalment this New Year's Day.

Maryborough's Highland Gathering was originally formed by Scottish squatters and businessmen in an attempt to recreate the New Year celebrations of their native home.

Today, the Highland Gathering attracts people from all across the country – athletes, dancers, musicians, and those who just want to soak up the incredible atmosphere of piped bands and traditional Scottish culture.

The program has something for everyone. A piped band street parade, all-day athletics, highland dancing on two stages all day, Highland games and traditional strongmen event.

Track events on the day range from 70-metre sprints to middle-distance races over 1500 metres. There are events for both men and women, including veterans. The athletics

program culminates with the running of the \$15,000 Max Martin Memorial Maryborough Gift, contested over 120 metres; now one of the country's most prestigious footraces.

Anyone who's attended the event over the past 35 years will have a lasting memory of the Girl on the Drum spectacular that has become a highlight of the New Year celebrations.

It features a highland dancer atop a base drum, lifted to the shoulders of three burly Scots. Flanked by a full piped band and other traditional dancers, it really is a sight and sound spectacular not to be missed.

There's plenty to keep the kids entertained too, with games, sideshows and rides happening throughout the day.

The day concludes with a free evening concert and fireworks display – a great way to celebrate the new year.

Step back in style at the Bull and Mouth

ONCE again Bull and Mouth business owners Jo and Mick Reid have highlighted the unique heritage of their early-1900s building by successfully combining old world charm with a new contemporary space in their recently opened hospitality offering – a wine and cocktail bar.

Jo said the bar has been really popular so far with locals and visitors.

“We felt the hotel really needed a nice bar where people can sit, enjoy a drink and relax,” she said.

“It is something a bit different in the town. People are popping in for pre-dinner drinks, catching up with friends and after-work gatherings. We can also cater for functions in this new space.”

As well as the standard drinks, the cocktail bar offers local wines, craft beer and an extensive cocktail menu.

The new wine and cocktail bar is the ideal complement to the Reid’s successful

accommodation and restaurant business, all run from the same iconic building.

The external grandeur of the Bull and Mouth is reflected in the décor and level of service guests receive. The accommodation includes 12 guest rooms offering from king single to king deluxe, with each room individually styled.

The fully-licensed café/restaurant serves breakfast and lunch from Sunday to Tuesday and breakfast, lunch and dinner Wednesday to Saturday.

Located in the heart of Maryborough, the Bull and Mouth Hotel is architecturally significant as an exceptionally fine early-20th century building. It is a notable example of the Edwardian Baroque style, which was widely adopted for public buildings in the early 20th century, but which is not common in country Victoria.

Today it forms an important element in the Maryborough streetscape.

MELBOURNE is often touted as the coffee capital of Australia (some suggest the world!). For visitors to the goldfields who consider themselves coffee connoisseurs, there is no need to miss out on your morning brew, with a variety of cafes scattered throughout central Victoria.

Main Street Coffee

SINCE opening its doors just over 12 months ago, Burgz, on the main street of Maryborough, has become a popular meeting place to catch up with friends.

Customers are not only attracted to the 'Instagrammable' décor and great menu; Burgz is gaining a reputation for serving great coffee.

Courtney Longmuir is one of two trained baristas who make the coffees, with the most common order a standard cappuccino with two sugars.

"We do occasionally get asked for unusual coffees - a customer the other day asked for a coffee that was at exactly 40 degrees," Courtney said.

Whatever your palate, Burgz has your coffee taste covered.

Destination Coffee

OWNER and proprietor of the Harcourt Produce & General Store, Annette Larsen, is a trained chef who has developed

her own coffee blend - 'Larsen' - combining four types of South American beans roasted by another provider.

"The unique barista coffee, craft beer and cider, local wines and produce, and pickles and preserves from our own kitchen garden adds to the authentic dining experience customers love," Annette said.

MALDON Rose in Maldon is a family run business that is quickly establishing itself as an industry leader.

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Happy little vegemites – spreading the word

VEGEMITE – it's a staple in most homes throughout Australia but few people actually know the origins of the celebrated breakfast spread. Beaufort woman Liza Robinson is determined to change all that.

"When we decided to move to Beaufort, my partner's doctor, from Melbourne, mentioned that his grandfather was from the Pyrenees. The doctor showed us this photo and it was him standing beside a sign out at Chute saying the inventor of vegemite was born here. He said, 'that was my grandfather'," Liza said.

"I couldn't believe that a pretty ordinary sign was all there was to celebrate the inventor of vegemite."

Liza became a woman on a mission. Not only could she see the tourism potential for the Pyrenees, she felt that the work of Cyril Callister should be acknowledged and honoured.

The doctor put Liza in touch with his brother, Jamie Callister, who had written a book about the grandfather he never knew. The Man Who Invented Vegemite explores the early life of a boy from the country who would invent one of the most iconic food products in the world.

"Cyril was from a poor working family that had come originally from the Isle of Mann for the goldrush. His father was a teacher and sold firewood," Liza said.

"He got scholarships to study science at both the School of Mines in Ballarat (now Federation University) and then Melbourne

Uni. During the first world war he helped the British develop ammunition and, when he returned to Australia, he was employed by a man called Fred Walker, one of the founders of the Kraft Walker Cheese company.

"Cyril was involved in the development of block cheese and then Walker said he wanted him to invent the Australian version of the British marmite."

Along with the Callister family, Liza has established a foundation which is a registered charity. Trademark issues mean they are unable to use the brand name vegemite, so the idea of the Cyril Callister Museum was born.

Liza is currently running the museum once a month from a pop-up at the back of Servo 23 in Beaufort. But she and the family have plans to expand to a permanent site in the main street of the town.

"Next year is the 100th anniversary of vegemite," Liza said.

"We are putting together an educational program and video about the story of Cyril's life that complies with educational requirements and Jamie will deliver it in schools throughout Australia. The video will also be played to school groups who visit the museum.

"The long-term goal is that any profit we make will go to an annual scholarship for regional students to study science at Federation University. We hope to create a full circle of the life of this remarkable man."

Rock and Country Legends Come to Beaufort

SOME of the biggest names in Australian music will perform at the Pyrenees Hideout music festival on February 11 at the Goldfields Recreation Reserve in Beaufort.

Featuring Kasey Chambers, Daryl Braithwaite and The Black Sorrows, other acts set to appear include Travis Collins, Caitlin Harnett and The Pony Boys, Bones and Jones, Marcus Cassells and the BAHU Collective and local Ballarat legend, Freya Josephine Hollick.

The multi-stage, all-ages festival is an opportunity for residents of the Pyrenees Shire to connect with their community and showcase what the region has to offer to guests from further afield.

Shuttle buses will operate from key regional centres including Avoca, Maryborough and Ballarat to enable safe travel to and from the event that will also feature food and wine tastings, children's activities, classic and special interest cars on display, a variety of workshops and an extensive market area.

The Pyrenees Hideout event will promote and support the services of rural and remote mental health, with opportunities also available for local community groups to fundraise through ticket sales.

Hideout Festival is proudly supported by Creative Victoria and Pyrenees Shire Council.

Tickets are already on sale at pyreneeshideout.com.au for an early bird price of \$75 with discounts offered for concession card holders, teenagers and families.

Budding artists are also making the most of the stunning backdrop, with Painting in the Pyrenees events proving popular with guests.

Established in 1969, Taltarni Vineyards is one of the pioneering wineries of Victoria's Pyrenees wine region. Owner John Goelet, a direct descendant of the Guestier wine merchant family of Bordeaux, discovered and purchased Taltarni Vineyard after conducting a worldwide search for a site comparable to the great vineyards of Bordeaux.

The first wine from Taltarni Vineyards was released in 1977; immediate success followed with the wine collecting gold at the Royal Melbourne Show – an early acknowledgment of the potential of the vineyard.

This award-winning tradition continues today with Taltarni Vineyards recognised by James Halliday as a 5 Red Star Winery in the 2023 Halliday Wine Companion.



Take a meandering walk, let go of the thoughts in your head, and focus on the present. The Pyrenees' state parks and forests have an extensive network of bushwalking and gravel riding trails.

Kick back and relax at Beaufort Lake, where the air feels fresh and clean. This man-made lake is great for fishing, water skiing, canoeing and swimming. As you stroll the banks of the

lake, you will find the Koori Art Trail with 12 art installations.

Escape the crowds at a secluded campsite within Mount Cole, Mount Buangor or Pyrenees State Forest. If you prefer a few more amenities, Avoca and Beaufort have caravan parks located by the river

or lake so be sure to pack the fishing rods!

Throughout summer there is a wide range of outdoor events hosted in the Pyrenees including The Hideout Music Festival, Sunday by the River, Wild Mount Trail Run and live music at cellar doors.

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Living history

HALF-WAY between Ballarat and Maryborough is the historic township of Clunes.

Clunes was the site of Victoria's first gold strike in 1851 which led to a gold rush which swept through central Victoria, resulting in a massive population boost for the state and great wealth for many.

In its heyday Clunes was the fifth largest town in the colony. These days, Clunes is an agricultural, pastoral and tourist township, nestled in a scenic valley.

Visitors to Clunes often say it is like stepping onto the set of a movie about life in the 1800s. Many of the original buildings in Clunes have been preserved from those gold rush days. Fraser Street is lined with 19th century buildings and shop fronts including the



National Hotel (1862), Club Hotel (1870) and Union Bank (1865).

For a glimpse at history through the looking glass, visit the Clunes Bottle Museum, located in a 1870s schoolhouse. See displays of over 6,000 rare and unusual bottles dating back to the gold rush.

Talbot comes alive on the third Sunday of the month with the Talbot Farmers and Talbot

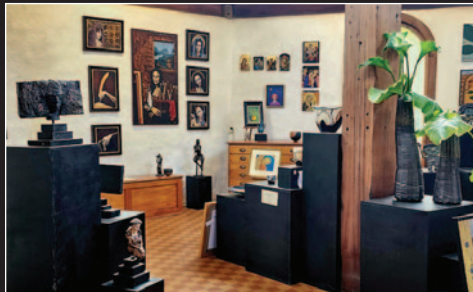


Town Hall Markets. Browse the stalls for fresh, home grown, home baked goods, find unique trinkets or plants and take the chance to chat to the makers and growers.

Gallery to open early 2023

FIRST opened in 1996, the Central Goldfields Art Gallery is located in the historic former Maryborough Fire Station building built in 1861.

The bell tower is now on the National Trust Register.

A major redevelopment of the gallery began in 2021, with the first exhibition in the newly updated gallery scheduled to open in early 2023.

The project is jointly funded by the Victorian Government and Central Goldfields Shire Council.

The design incorporates curves to reflect the historical architecture and skylights reveal views up to the bell tower. Views out to the garden and street connect the outside to the interior.



An Indigenous interpretive garden designed by Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation will adjoin the gallery in 2024.

The gallery features a diverse program of regularly changing exhibitions, including works from their permanent collection, curated and touring exhibitions. Following its reopening early in 2023, the gallery will also hold regular public programs and activities and can give guided tours and take bookings for tour groups.

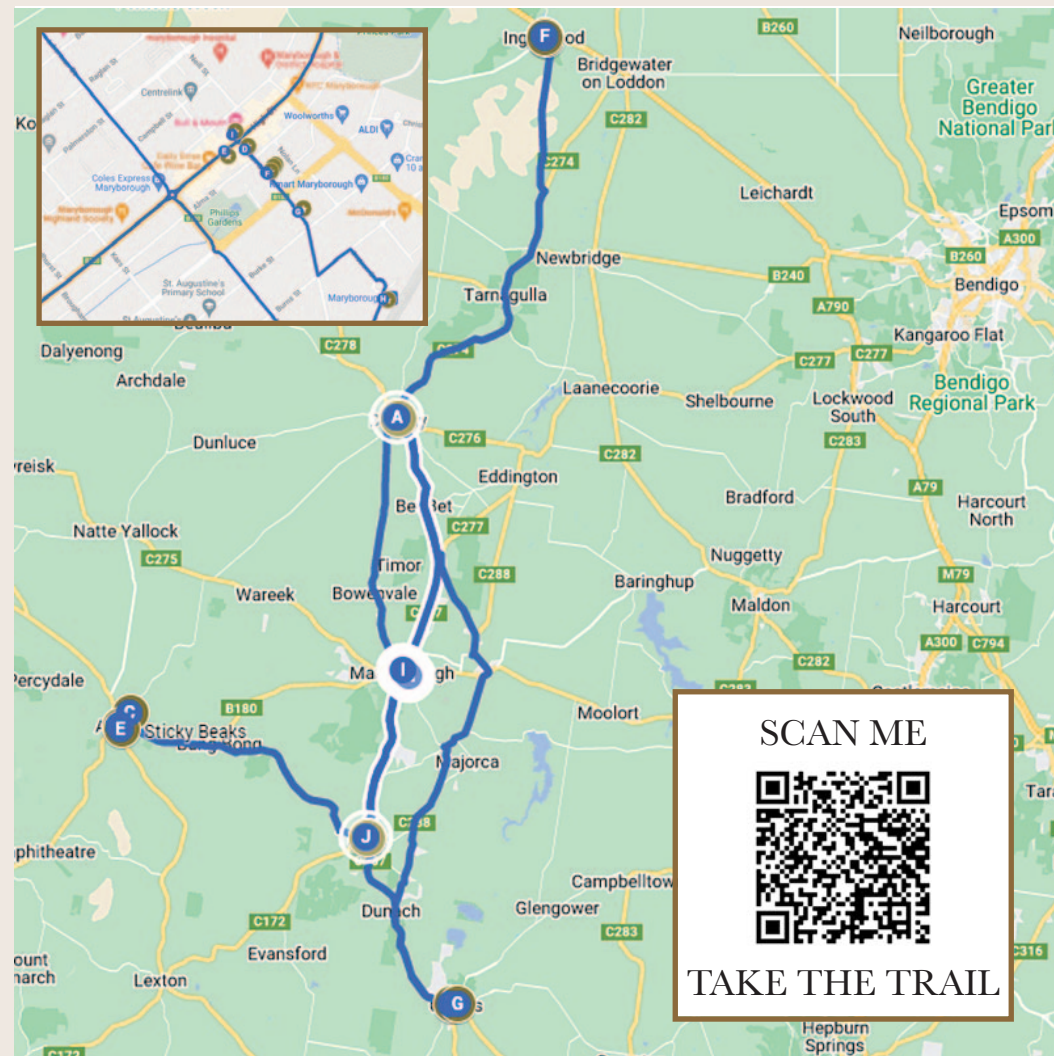

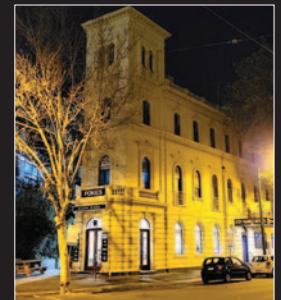

Squirrel Gully Saffron Limoncello

If your lemon tree has delivered a bumper harvest as ours has, here's an excellent way to put them to good use and continue the party long into winter.

Makes 1.5 litres

INGREDIENTS:

6 lemons
750 ml boiled water
300 grams sugar
500 ml Vodka
150 milligrams Squirrel Gully Saffron,
(approx. 1 tablespoon or 25 threads)

METHOD:

Thoroughly wash your lemons to remove any wax or residue.

Use a sharp paring knife or potato peeler to remove the rind. Take time to remove all pith from the underside with a knife as this will make your limoncello bitter.

In a saucepan, make a simple sugar syrup by



boiling the water and sugar over high heat until the sugar dissolves.

Sterilize a large glass jar with an airtight lid. Combine the cooled sugar syrup, Vodka, lemon rind and saffron threads in the jar, stir then seal tightly.

Allow the mix to infuse for 30 days before serving.

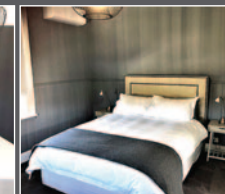
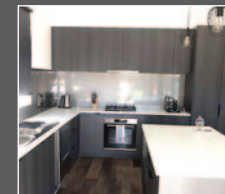

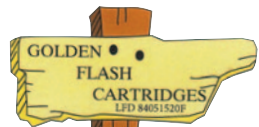

Discover Dunolly



THE historic gold mining town of Dunolly attracts tourists from around the globe to explore the living history of this tiny town.

At its height in the 1860s, Dunolly had a population as high as 35,000. Today it has less than 1000 residents. The main street retains attractive buildings from its boom days, and many have found a new lease of life as cafes, galleries and antique/bric-a-brac shops.

While in Dunolly pop into the museum in the main street. The museum display includes a replica of the 69 kg 'Welcome Stranger' gold nugget found 14 km north at Moliagul in 1869,

over 20 gold nugget replicas, 70 historic guns as well as a 4-million-year-old fossilised wombat jaw and relics of early European settlement.

It also holds an extensive collection of records and information dating back to the mid-1800s and is a popular destination for people researching family history

As visitors explore the shops in the main street, they can also discover history, with plaques and photographs commemorating significant buildings such as the Post Office (1891), Town Hall and Court House (1862) and the restored Police Lock Up and Stables (1863).



The Dunolly Museum

at 75 Broadway, Dunolly, Victoria, is operated by the Goldfields Historical & Arts Society.

Snake safety

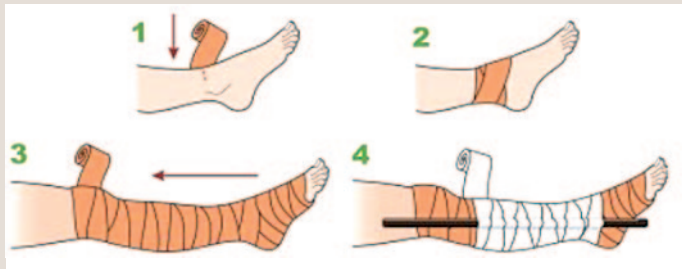
WHILE it seems we have been waiting forever for the rain to stop so we can explore the great outdoors, it is a good idea to make sure you are prepared before heading out prospecting, walking or cycling.

Snakes are out and about this time of year, so pop in to a camping specialist, such as Aussie Outback, to pick up a specially prepared snake bite kit.

Although snakes will try to avoid people, sometimes you may disturb a snake and end up being bitten. St John's Ambulance have put together the following steps to follow if you or a companion are bitten:



- Lay the casualty down and provide reassurance
- Apply a pressure immobilisation bandage:
 - 1/ Wrap a broad pressure bandage around the bite as soon as possible
 - 2/ Apply a firm heavy elasticised roller bandage just above the fingers or toes and work your way upwards on the limb. Wrap the bandage past the snakebite and as far up the limb as possible
 - 3/ Ensure the bandage is applied firmly without hindering blood circulation
 - 4/ Splint the bandaged limb



- Ensure the patient remains still
 - Call triple zero (000) for medical assistance
 - Record the time the bite occurred and when the bandage was applied
 - Wait with the casualty, monitor and record any changes in their condition
- DO NOT clean the wound or attempt to suck venom from the bite.

Laze by the lake at Laanecoorie

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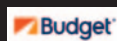
