Family recipe for success

A LOVE of history, passion for renovation projects, and an enduring family connection to baking inspired Rebecca Barnett (pictured) to buy and restore Australia's oldest continually operating bakery in Maldon.


Built in 1854, Maldon Bakery is one of the oldest brick buildings in town. Its showpiece is a rare, wood-fired scotch oven, which is used to make

traditionally baked bread, pies and cakes.

Historically, the bakery was built to feed the thousands of hungry miners who arrived in the region during the gold rush.

Rebecca purchased the business in 2022 and has since completed refurbishments designed to preserve heritage significance, increase efficiency and introduce more sustainable practices.

The restoration included repairs to the 170-



Baking has always been a family affair, with Rebecca coming from a family of five generations of bakers. Maldon Bakery's logo was designed by her mother based on a sign that once existed in her grandparents' bakery.

Future plans include finding more ways to reduce the business's carbon footprint and growing herbs and vegetables at the premises to supply the bakery.

With a National Bakery Industry of Australia 'Bakery of the month' award for June 2023 under its belt – plus a mention in an article in the New York Times in April – Maldon Bakery is already adding a new chapter to the long history of the town.

Still House a family affair

IN THE Pyrenees valley of Glenpatrick is Mrs Baker's Still House, a 100 percent solar powered small-batch distillery making award-winning gins, liqueurs and, soon to be released, whisky.

Jane (aka Mrs Baker) is proud of her family's achievement. Daughter Elizabeth is the lead distiller, in charge of the gins and liqueurs; her father Benjamin works alone side her on the newest product. Whisky.

"We are so excited: Elizabeth and Benjamin have been distilling and maturing a whisky made from barley malted locally in Ballarat. They are delightful, complex and rich," Jane said.

Australian whisky must be matured in an oak barrel for two years before it can be classed as 'whisky'. Jane said the team at Mrs Baker's seems to be holding their breath, waiting for the whisky to be bottled this September.



"When you walk into the barrel room, you can smell the beautiful aromas. It is humbling that people are already 'calling dibs' on a bottle for themselves" Jane said.

Mrs Baker's Still House cellar door is open for tastings and sales on Saturdays and Sundays from 11am – 4pm.



Art in the heart of the goldfields

CENTRAL Victoria is gaining a reputation as an art-lover's goldmine, with an eclectic mix of galleries scattered throughout the goldfields.

The redevelopment of the Central Goldfields Art Gallery, as well as the annual Tiny Towns Art Trail in autumn, have highlighted to visitors the diverse range of artwork and artists who call the region home.






Spring is an ideal time for a road trip of artistic discovery, with exhibitions taking place at most of the galleries just a short drive from Maryborough. Central Goldfields Art Gallery features art depicting the goldfields from two local artists, Tiffany Titshall and Christopher Orr, as well as *Terminus*, a touring exhibition from the national gallery of Australia.

Just out of Maryborough, in Adelaide Lead, is Possum Gully Gallery.

Owned and operated by local artist Patricia Walsh, this unique mudbrick gallery will feature the annual spring exhibition, officially opened on Melbourne Cup Weekend.



Art Trax Gallery is housed in the historic Beaufort Railway Station. Featuring work from local Pyrenees artists, throughout spring it will feature the work of Angela Gerrard, whose passion for pastel painting has seen her win numerous awards, including Best Pyrenees Artist.

From Beaufort it is just a 35-minute drive to Avoca, where you will find another beautifully restored railway station known as Gallery 127, home of the famous glow-in-the-dark Barking Owl silo artwork.

Until September 25, visitors will be treated to the work of internationally acclaimed local

artist Liadaan (Lyndel Thomas). Liadaan's work reflects her world travels as well as her love of her home in the Central Goldfields. This exhibition will be followed by Clunes artist Trevor Balen.


Forty minutes from Avoca is St Arnaud, where the railway station is known as The Raillery Hub. This spring the Hub features St Arnaud born and raised, Hannah Sutton, now a prominent artist and principal instructor at The Florence Academy of Art, alongside the introspective prints of the globally experienced Malini Lewis.


Thirty-eight acres of living heritage...

THE Lake Goldsmith Steam Preservation Association Inc was established in the late 1950s with a handful of remnant engines operating in a paddock nostalgically re-creating a bygone era.

From this point the movement has advanced to the position, where not only is it acclaimed as 'Australia's premier steam rally'; but to that of international recognition, with changing sheds and displays.

Last year's November rally was cancelled due to the devastating flood that inundated the site, flooding 80 percent of the display sheds and causing major damage to the roads and displays.

Throughout the summer months members and friends rallied together and were able to

Bird watching in the goldfields

Local resident Barb Williams (aka Barb-the-Birder) has lived in Lillicur for the past 34 years. An avid bird watcher for more than 60 years, Barb has generously agreed to share her insight into the wildlife visitors to the region can expect to encounter during spring.

Nature springs to lig By Barb Williams

THERE is excitement in the air as the advent of spring means new life. Birds are all a-twitter, establishing breeding territories, calling for mates.

The heady perfume of fruit trees and garden plants in blossom, leaves unfurling, and buds bursting attracts newly-emerged butterflies and moths. Insects abound, providing a source of necessary protein for hungry nestlings.

Reptiles appear from snug winter retreats; lizards grace our gardens again and snakes bask in the warm sun.

Frog species seek suitable breeding places at dams and damp areas, which resonate with their calls.

Swooping around at dusk, small bats become active, enjoying the abundant insect harvest.







Bird watching in the goldfields

SPORTING iridescent blue and black plumage, often carrying the gift of a petal in its beak, the male superb fairy wren ('blue wren') chases the female all about the garden as she leads him a merry dance.

Although it's hard to name a personal favourite, the handsome diamond firetail is a small finch, seen singly, as a pair or in small group. I love to see them feeding on grass seeds in the paddock or splashing vigorously in the birdbath. I'm often alerted to their presence by their drawn out, ascending whistle.


Spring is such an exciting time in our Box-Ironbark area, and we are so lucky to witness the increased activity and growth in the animals, birds and plants that depend on this habitat.
