The best Christmas gift ever: new homes for Tennant Creek residents

JUST in time for Christmas, Venture Housing Company handed over three of five homes to happy Tennant Creek tenants – complete with locally sourced 'welcome' "We have built strong relationships and partnerships in Tennant Creek." hampers to celebrate the occasion.

The homes, situated on Peko Road, are located within a secure complex and compose two three bedroom homes with two bathrooms and three one bedroom and one bathroom homes. The complex is gated with a landscaped environment.

The homes were built by local company T&J Contractors with the solar power installed by Territory Indigenous enterprise DICE

Venture Housing Chair Allan McGill said the company understands the Territory's unique housing environment and continue to acutely seek partnerships to provide innovative,

"We have built strong relationships and partnerships in Tennant Creek and our research and engagement within the town identified clear and pressing needs and a high demand for affordable housing to accommodate workers on low to moderate incomes and to assist the local community and businesses to recruit and retain their key workers," said Mr McGill.

Venture Housing is a not-for-profit housing provider focusing on providing rental housing for low to moderate income earners in the NT who are struggling to find a home.

The company now owns 177 dwellings and manages a further 11 properties in Darwin and Palmerston, providing housing to low to moderate income Territorians at less than 75 per cent of the market rental levels.



Barkly artist represents in esteemed Territory art comp

THEY say a picture is worth a thousand words and this year's Portrait of a Senior Territorian Art Award winner is certainly no exception.

Hosted by the Araluen Arts Centre in Alice Springs, Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage Chansey Paech addressed an impressively crowded (albeit socially distanced) gallery space before announcing the third, second and first prize winners as judged by Marlene Rubuntja, Kieran Finnane and Chips Mackinolty.

Taking home \$500 for his portrait of Veronica Dobson, artist, sculptor and teacher Henry Smith was awarded third prize, with Deepu Jose Kollannoor taking out second place and a total of \$2,000 for his portrait of Jennifer Dowling.

First prize (and a total of \$7,000 prize money) was awarded to Darwin artist Robyn Frances for her portrait of Woolwonga storyteller John Scrutton, with Minister Paech describing the winning work 'John' as a "wonderful piece."

"It's amazing to see the high quality of Territory artists work here profiling senior Territorians and their contributions to the Northern Territory," he said.

Proudly representing the Barkly, Angelina Naidu's portrait of a an elder in the Arlparra Community (pictured) - entitled 'The gentleman 2020' - depicted a man of "generosity and grace that you don't see so much anymore," she said.

"He is a man of few words but always sure to speak his mind to express gratitude or an opinion on the well-being


of young people.





IN the lead up to International Volunteer Day last week, it was fitting the local Country Women's Association branch was successful in securing a funds boost.


The CWA was allocated \$1,350 in the 2020 round of Supplementary Volunteer Grants, delivered by Volunteering NT.




THE Tennant Creek Lions Club's Christmas cheer was in full swing when it organised a grand festive lunch for our local senior citizens on Saturday.


