Vaccination campaign ramps up in the Ba

Barkly residents to take the COVID-19 virus seriously, saying everyone has a responsibility to keep the community safe. CEO Barb Shaw says the virus does not discriminate

culture or religion and natural medicines are no match for COVID.

The Barkly region was identified by the Commonwealth Government as a priority area to improve vaccination uptake," said Ms Shaw.

"At the time the data revealed that across the Barkly, fewer than 20 per cent of the region's mostly Aboriginal population had received both doses despite the availability of the vaccine.

Ms Shaw believes the low vaccination rates reasons are largely due to misinformation through social media and

ANYINGINYI Health Aboriginal Corporation is urging the lack of information available. Based on the low uptake, Anyinginyi, with the support of the Commonwealth Government have initiated a COVID-19 rollout plan for the region.

'To improve coordination with over vaccine providers and support stakeholders in the Barkly, we will work closely with the NT Government's Department of Health, the Commonwealth Government, the Royal Flying Doctor Service and the Aboriginal Medical Services Alliance NT," she said.

"We have deployed clinicians and public health staff to travel to many of the remote communities to inform people on the health implications of the virus and the need to get vaccinated.

While states and territories across the nation are preparing to open borders resulting in high population mobility, the Barkly is an extremely vulnerable and high risk area with its low vaccination rate

Ms Shaw said Chief Minister Michael Gunner's announcement to open up the Territory's border on Monday, Anyinginyi has intensified its COVID-19 vaccination campaign.

"We will continue with our public health campaign and vaccination rollout with the support of recruiting local engagement officers in each remote locality to provide community-led and culturally-appropriate engagement, communication and promotional materials," she said.

'We will take a 'saturation' vaccination distribution model: visit, visit again and again.

"Anyinginyi teams with our vaccination nurses will stay for extended periods of time in the communities with a minimum period of one week

To further boost the vaccination rollout, Anyinginyi will continue to conduct its pop-up vaccination clinics in Tennant Creek.

John Fitz Jakamarra was nominated for his dedication to being a community mentor to the welfare, wellbeing and reintegration of local people in the Barkly community.

John is a key member of the NT Shelter's Barkly Regional Accommodation Action Group.

An NT Shelter spokesperson said John is committed to supporting to those who have been impacted or at risk of being impacted by the justice system.

"Over the many years he has supported many local men, both young and old, who have had difficulty settling back into their community following custodial sentences," she said.

"Not only does John create the connection between the incarcerated and their family members living in the Barkly by conveying messages and sharing information.

Without our children we are nothing. They are the only future we have.

There is a lot we don't know about how COVID-19 will affect our children but we do know that we have to protect them to make sure their lives are fulfilled.

It is our job, as parents and kinship relatives and family members to protect them and the best way we can do that is to protect ourselves. To make sure we don't get sick and our friends and family don't get sick.

The Northern Land Council supports the call by AMSANT that urgent steps are needed to contain the COVID-19 outbreak in Katherine and the Big Rivers region of the NT.

For everyone in the Katherine and Big Rivers region the CHO has given us all clear messages – get vaccinated; use the Territory Check In App; if you feel no good, stay away from work and other people and get tested for COVID-19; wash your hands and use hand sanitiser regularly and maintain social distancing where possible.

We also need to keep a good look out over the next few weeks and months. The NLC's message for everyone travelling interstate this holiday season is to enjoy your time with family and friends but please, don't be the one to bring it back to the NT or your community.

Finally, I'd like to wish you all an enjoyable festive season and look forward to seeing you all happy--and most importantly--healthy, in the New Year.

Holiday arrangements for Centrelink

SERVICES Australia customers are reminded of changes to payments and services over the upcoming Christmas and New Year holiday period.

All service centres and most phone lines providing Centrelink, Medicare and Child Support services will be closed on the public holidays from Monday 27 December 2021 through to Wednesday 29 December 2021, and Monday 3 January 2022.

Services Australia General Manager Hank Jongen said Centrelink, Medicare and Child Support customers can still access self-service options during this period.

"During the busy holiday period, the easiest and most convenient way to do your business with us is by using your online account through myGov, the Express Plus mobile apps, or phone self-service," Mr Jongen said.

"These services are available 24/7, even on public holidays. This means you can use myGov to apply for an advance payment, update your details, lodge a Medicare claim, or report your employment income.

"It's also important to remember your reporting and payment dates may change if they normally fall on a public holiday over the Christmas and New Year period.

"If the date you normally report falls on a public holiday during this period, you can report early to avoid any delays in your

payments.

"If you are working and receive employment income, you'll need to tell us what you expect to be paid for the full assessment period. You must also do this for any other changes that may affect your payment.

"You can correct any mistakes to your estimate within 14 days, or when you next report.

"An easy way to check reporting dates is through the Centrelink online account, on the Services Australia website, or via phone self-service.

"You can still report to us, even when we're closed. However, if you do this on a public holiday, it means you won't get your payment until after the public holiday.

"Keep in mind that any automatic payments we make won't be delayed by the public holidays, but some people might get their payment earlier than usual. This means you may need to budget carefully until your next payment."

BasicsCard customers can still transfer funds to their BasicsCard over the public holidays by using self-service or calling 1800 132 594 at any time. BasicsCard balances can also be checked at any time by calling 1800 057 111.

OPEN LETTER TO THE BARKLY REGIONAL COUNCIL

The Barkly Regional Council received a petition from approximately 628 resident requesting the following:

• Development of an Animal Management Plan: Barkly Regional Council agreed and further advised that it would be undertaken by people/entity with the appropriate skills and expertise and in consultation with all stakeholders

• Animal Management Services on Urban Living Areas (Town Camps); Barkly Regional Council agreed to resume all Animal Management Services on Town Camps and that discussions would occur with Julalkari Council Aboriginal Corporation, Anyinginyi Health Aboriginal Corporation, stakeholders and residents of Town Camps to develop a service model/agreement.

• The Barkly Regional Council has not responded to excursions of animals onto the amenity of the Tennant Creek community and its residents. Two vehicular accidents have occurred due to stray animals.

• Remedies exist under Section 285 of the NT Local Government Act. Infrastructure Grants are available from the NT and Federal Governments. The Barkly Regional Council has a duty of care to act to preven future accidents, injuries and/or deaths.

• The Barkly Regional Council has not responded to provide funds in this financial year for Animal Management Services or to indicate Animal Management Services funds going forward.

• The Barkly Regional Council as requested has not been able to provide records of expenditure of funds for Animal Management Services since 2011/2012 on an annual basis.

• The Barkly Regional Council introduced a levy of \$40.00 per ratepayer in 2011/12, amount raised approximately \$121,000.

• The Barkly Regional Council ceased the Animal Management levy of \$40.00 per ratepayer and replaced it in 2014/15 with a 15% levy to be included in General Rates up until now. The estimated combined amount raised by Barkly Regional Council since 2011/12 is approximately \$700,000 of new funds which the Barkly Regional Council is unable to provide the expenditure figures actually spent on Animal Management services.




