## New state-of-the-art weather radar for Tennant underway

WITH unpredictable weather being experienced due to ex-Tropical Cyclone Tiffany in the north, many might be wondering where Tennant Creek's new \$17 million radar is. The good news is that the radar is being built and expected to be completed by December, and be fully operational early 2023.

The base of the weather radar is being built in Gladstone, Queensland, while the radar is under construction in Germany and will be shipped when ready.

A spokesperson for the Federal Government's Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications said the radar will use the newest state-ofthe-art technology to better support the agriculture, pastoral, transport, mining and local community to manage the impact of rainfall and improve decision-making.

"Stakeholder engagement and consultation remains a key focus of the project and cultural heritage discussions are underway with the Patta Aboriginal Corporation," he said. The Federal Government provided \$15 million for the facility with the NT Government chipping in \$2.4 million.





### Barkly residents left in the dark over COVID vaccination rates: Edgington

WHILE Territorians continue to follow the ever-changing mandates to stop the spread of COVID in communities, residents in the Barkly are feeling the frustration over a lack of information about cases and vaccination rates in the region and long waits for test results.

Barkly MLA Steve Edgington said Chief Minister Michael Gunner's government still refuses to tell Barkly residents what the vaccination rate for Tennant Creek is.

"How can the Gunner Government expect to increase vaccination rates in remote areas without a plan, without proper communication and while reducing health services at the same time?" said Mr Edgington.

"The Gunner Government needs to go back to providing daily updates for people in the Barkly and across the Territory. They need to be open and transparent about the real situation."

Mr Edgington paid tribute to the amazing work going across the Barkly by the Northern Territory Police, NT Health and Aboriginal corporations, Barkly Regional Council and all front-line workers.

"I have no doubt there are positive casein the Barkly, so please to reduce the risk of spreading COVID in the communities, it is important for everyone to follow all health directions," he said.

As of 8pm on 12 January, there were 550 new cases of COVID recorded Territory wide, taking the number of active cases to around 3,000.

No details of where the cases were recorded were released.

The *Tennant Times* contacted the office of the Minister for Health, Natasha Fyles, for detailed regional numbers but did not receive a response at time of publication.

NATIONAL food supply chains have been flailing due to staff shortages after the Omicron variant of COVID-19 continues to effect the country.

However, it seems it has largely unaffected the Barkly region, with just minor hiccups being experienced.

Tennant Creek IGA spokesperson said the outlet was proud of its customers for their patience and adherence to the COVID precautions over the holiday period.

"There has been no panic buying and supplies continue to hold up well, largely because our supplies come from Adelaide, which has been least affect by supply chain issues than freight and distribution centres on the east coast," he said.

"We have maintained restrictions on the purchases of some essential items as a precaution and we are keeping an eye on the national retail situation.
