Barkly nurse a finalist in prestigious awards

A BARKLY registered nurse has been announced as a finalist in the 2024 Nursing and Midwifery Awards

Annette (Nettie) Hodgson-Taylor is one of three finalists in the Excellence in Aboriginal Health category. Joining her is Amelia Bannister and Peter Mitchell from the Top End.

The Ali Curung-based nurse and clinic manager said she was gobsmacked at the nomination and looks forward to travelling to Darwin in early May, where the winners will be announced at a gala dinner.

The finalist achievement is a highlight in Nettie's life after a tough life growing up with alcoholic parents and losing her 15-year-old son which threw her into years of grief and despair.

Initially working in hospitality as a trainer, Nettie turned her focus to nursing after her husband Lloyd urged her to get help with her grief.

"I grew up living in houses with no power and no windows - sometimes stealing food from my siblings," she said.

"What you see in the Tennant Creek town camps was my life, so this nomination means a lot.

"I have gone from working in hospitality to hospitality of the spirit, which what I describe nursing as

"Nursing is one of the best jobs honestly and it is so rewarding – I couldn't imagine doing any other work now."

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the Awards, which celebrate the exemplary work of nurses and midwives positively impacting the health and wellbeing of Territorians every single day.



A record-breaking number of 289 nominations across 12 categories were submitted for the 2024 Awards, with the Team Excellence category having received the highest number of nominations. 39.

There are 12 different Award categories for enrolled and registered nurses and midwives working in any healthcare setting in the Territory, and a dedicated Registered Undergraduate of Student Nurse/Midwife Award.

The categories recognise excellence in client care, education, aged care, research, professional leadership and commitment to the nursing and midwifery profession.

Chief Minister announces new \$11.5m Watch House for Tennant Creek



THE Territory Government has announced this week that Tennant Creek will receive an \$11.5 million Watch House as part of its \$125m Police Infrastructure program.

The NT Government is investing a total of \$25 million for five years in its plan to provide police the best facilities to keep the Territory safe.

This funding is in addition to the extra 200 police officers for the Territory, upgraded communication technology and improved response times, and funding to secure the future of the Territory Safety Division.

Overall, the 2024 Budget invests an additional \$570 million over five years to implement the recommendations of the Police Review and fully establish the Territory Safety Division. This will mean more police, more infrastructure, and better facilities.

Chief Minister Eva Lawler said her comprehensive and common sense plan to lower crime in the Territory means will give police the resources and support to do the job – that means more officers, new equipment and upgraded infrastructure.

"We have seen the positive impact the Palmerston Police Station has made locally and I want to see similar positive results right across Territory," she said.

"We're showing our support to police with record funding being delivered because nothing is more important to me than lowering crime and keeping Territorians safe.

Minister for Police Brent Potter said the Territory's police officers are the best in the country and they deserve the best facilities long into the future, and that is exactly what we are delivering.

"We will deliver more police on our streets, more vans on our roads and also the new and upgraded infrastructure and equipment police need to do the job," he said.

Murray **Valley** encephalitis detected in the Barkly

NT Health is reminding Territorians to remain vigilant and protect themselves against mosquito bites after the virus surveillance program detected Murray Valley encephalitis (MVE) in the Top Barkly and Top End regions.

MVE is an uncommon but potentially fatal disease that occurs after being bitten by a mosquito carrying the MVE virus. From now until June, is the highest risk period for serious mosquito-borne diseases, including MVE.

Eight cases of MVE were recorded in the Northern Territory (NT) in 2023, with two fatal cases.

Surveillance and testing of mosquitoes for diseases in the NT is carried out by NT Health and the Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade (DITT).

Mosquitoes collected in February and March 2024 returned



positive results for MVE for sites in both Tennant Creek can progress to delirium, coma, permanent brain damage and Darwin

So far in 2024, almost 42,000 mosquitoes have been tested across all NT regions for diseases including MVE, Japanese encephalitis and Kunjin virus.

Nina Kurucz, Director of Medical Entomology, NT Health, said the positive surveillance results suggest the MVE virus is present in mosquitoes throughout the NT.

"The only protection from MVE, is to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes," Ms Kurucz said.

"To ensure the best protection from mosquito bites, it's important to cover up, use insect repellents and avoid areas where mosquitoes are active, such as swamps and

"Infants and children especially need to be protected."

Symptoms of MVE can include headaches, fever, nausea and vomiting, muscle aches, seizures, tremor or fits and

or death.

Anyone concerned about symptoms should contact their healthcare provider. Avoiding mosquito bites is a top priority. Learn more about MVE on the NT Health website at https:// nt.gov.au/wellbeing/health-conditions-treatments/viral

To minimise the chance of being bitten by mosquitoes, people should:

- · Make sure infants and young children are well protected from mosquitoes
- Cover up with long light-coloured sleeved shirts and pants, socks and shoes
- Use insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalypt (PMD)
- Avoid areas where mosquitoes are active, especially after sun down
- Use mosquito-proof tents when camping.

Mataranka Water Allocation Plan

The draft Mataranka Water Allocation Plan is now open for the community to provide their feedback. The plan applies to the Tindall Limestone Aquifer, an area of approximately 9,282 km² that includes Mataranka township, Elsey National Park, and the iconic Bitter and Rainbow springs.

The plan's focus is on maintaining spring flows and ecological conditions during dry years while providing long-term water security for drinking water, agriculture, horticulture and mining enterprises in the region. The plan protects the groundwater resource and flows in the Roper River by managing water extraction in line with climatic variability.

A protected environmental area may also be declared by Minister for the Environment, Climate Change and Water to further protect this important water resource.
